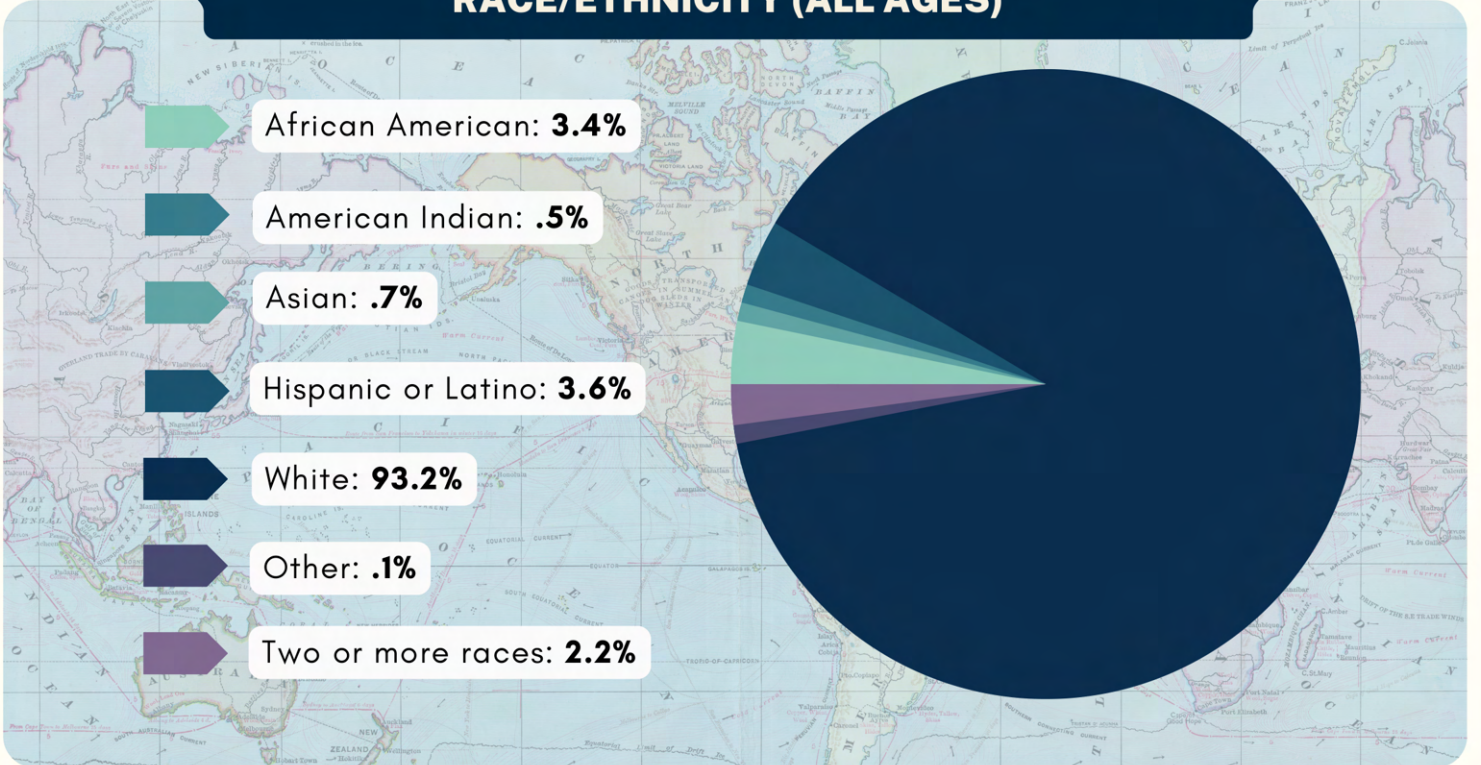

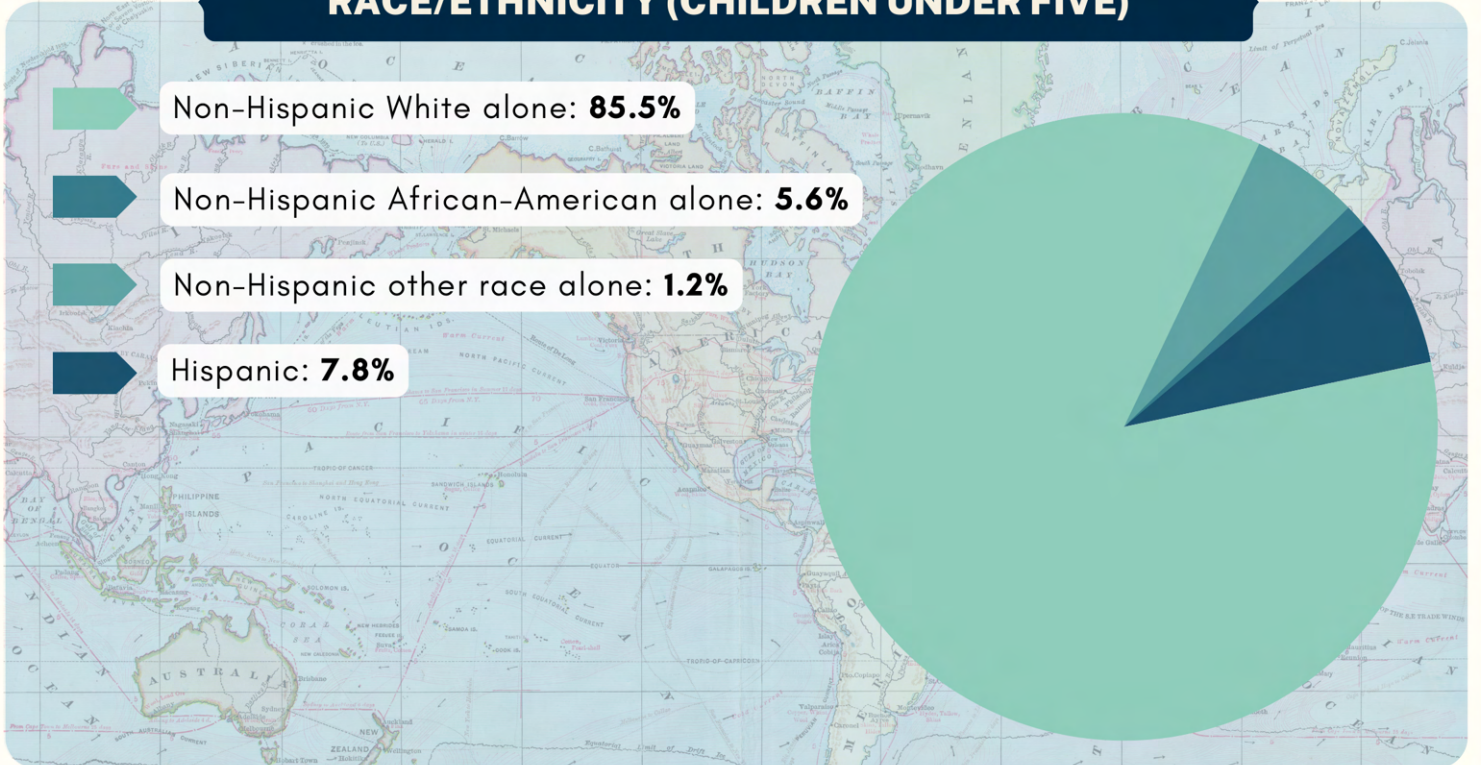

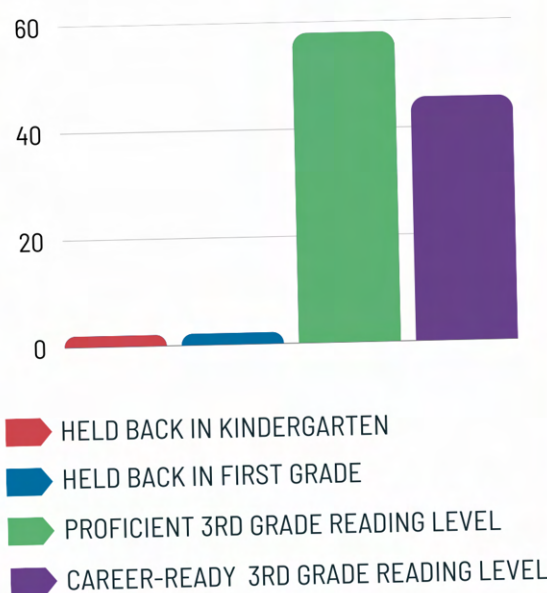

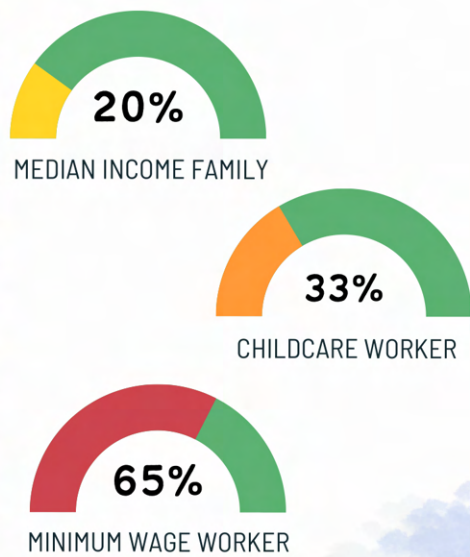

The average parent in Transylvania County spends \$1,028/month for an infant spot at a licensed, 5-star center.

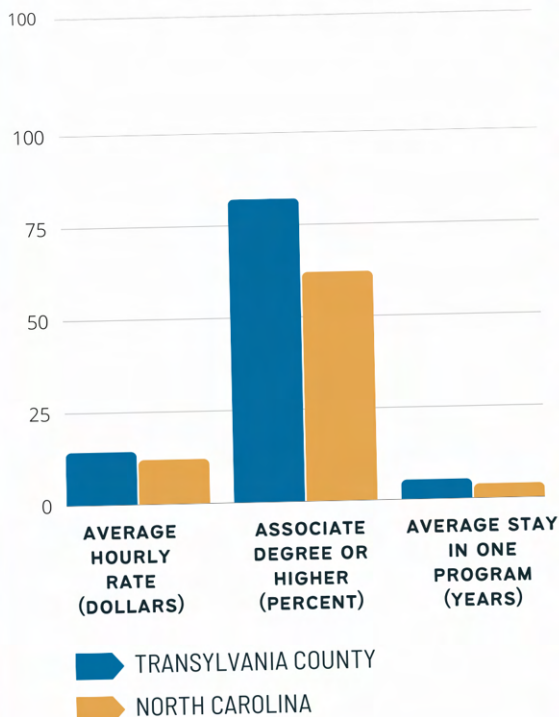


CHILDCARE AS A PERCENT OF INCOME

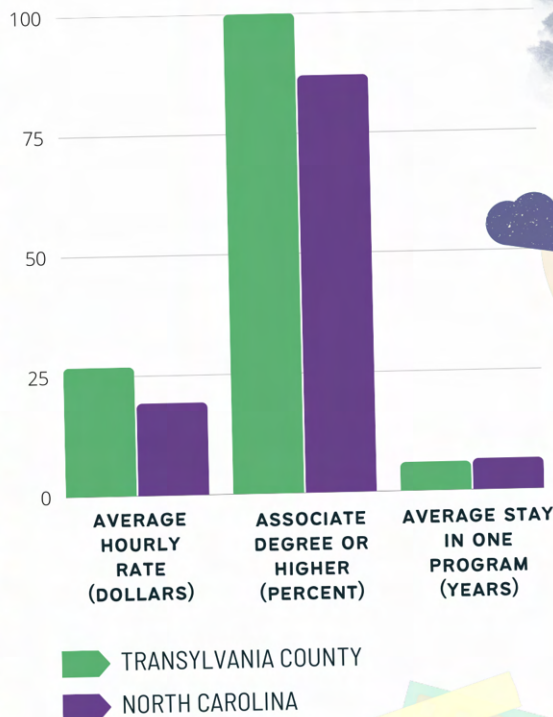

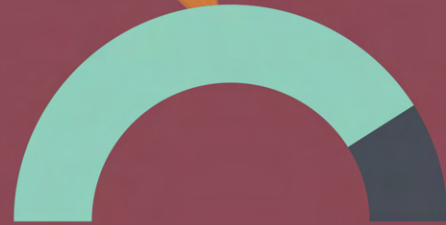

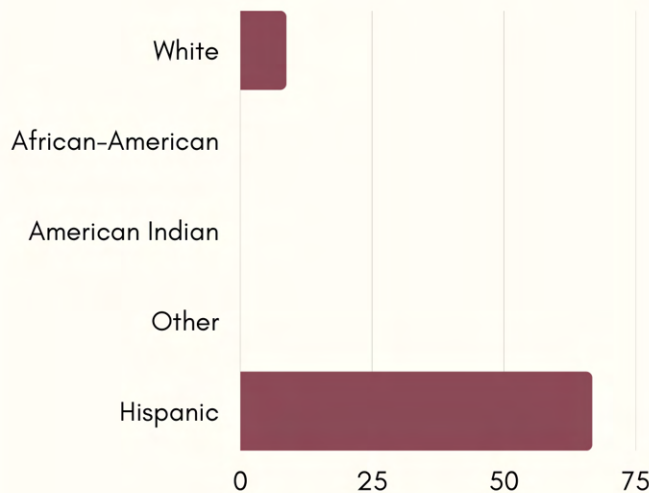

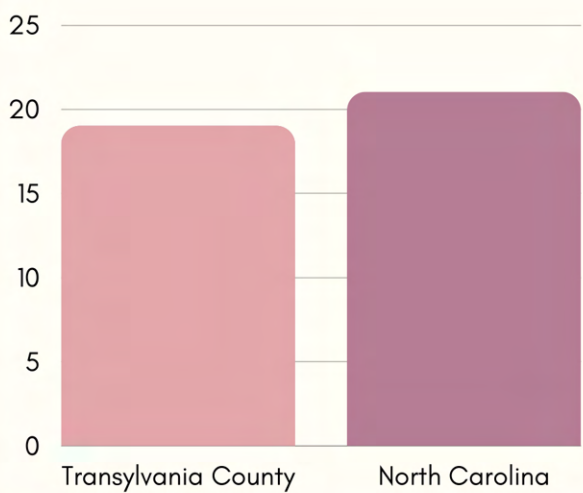

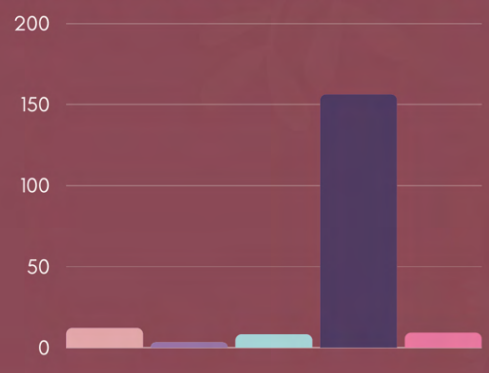

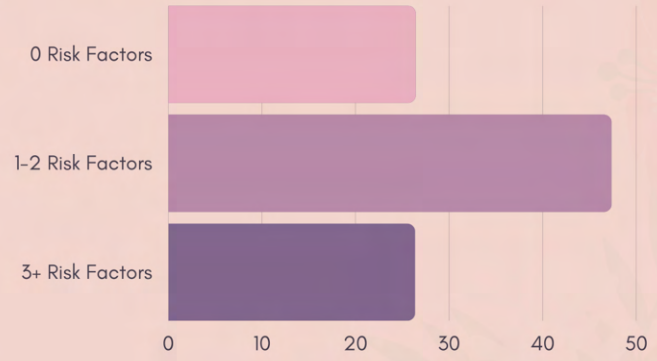

SCORES ARE BASED ON FACTORS SUCH AS SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, RACE/ETHNICITY, AND HOUSING.

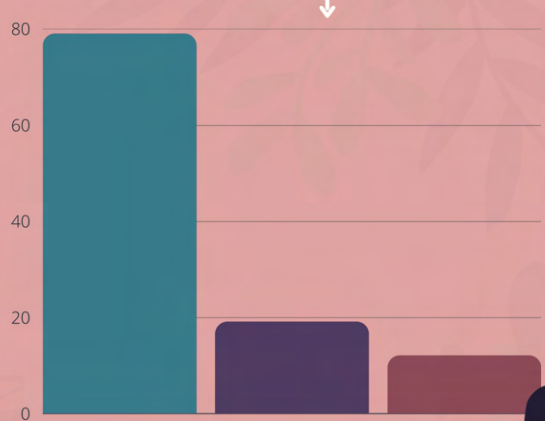

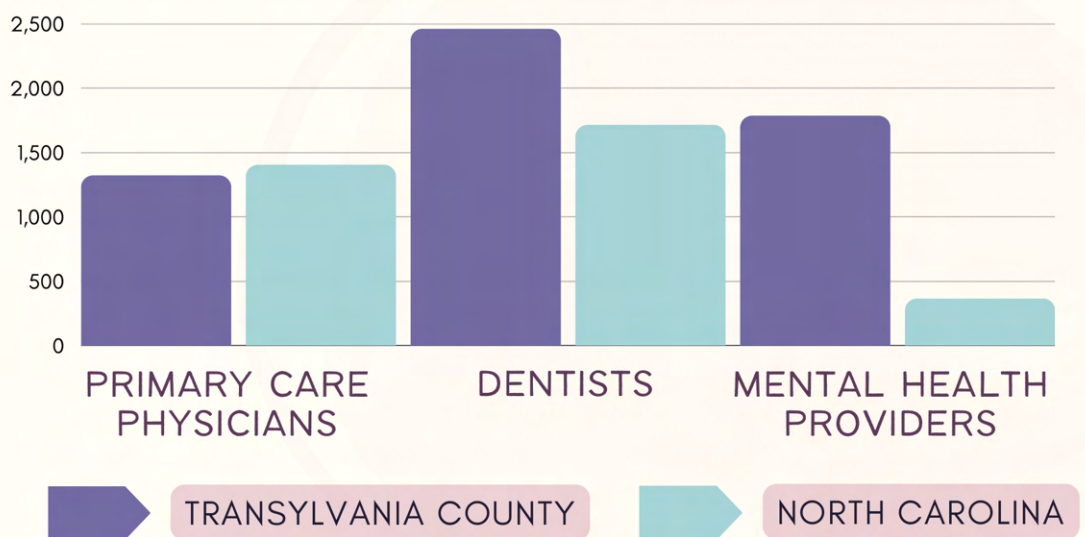

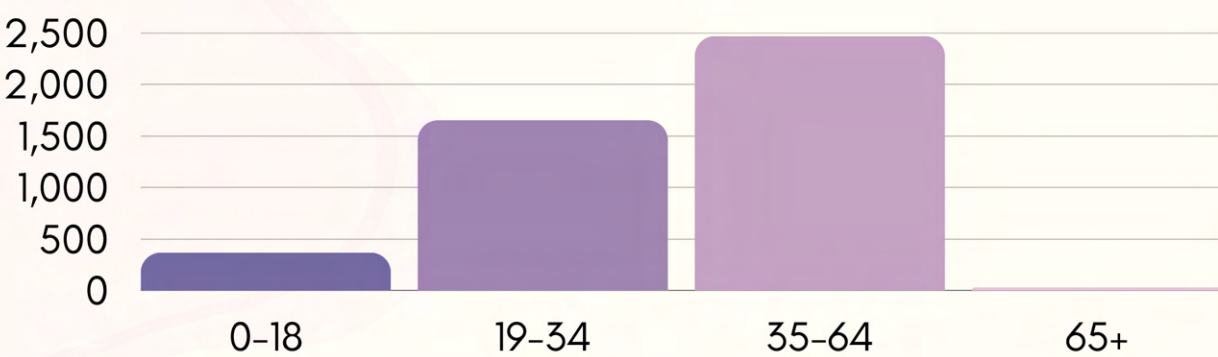

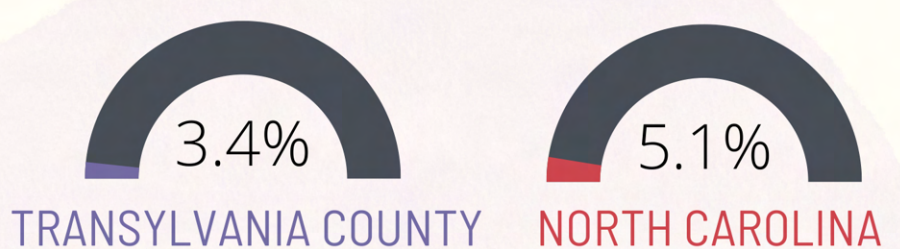

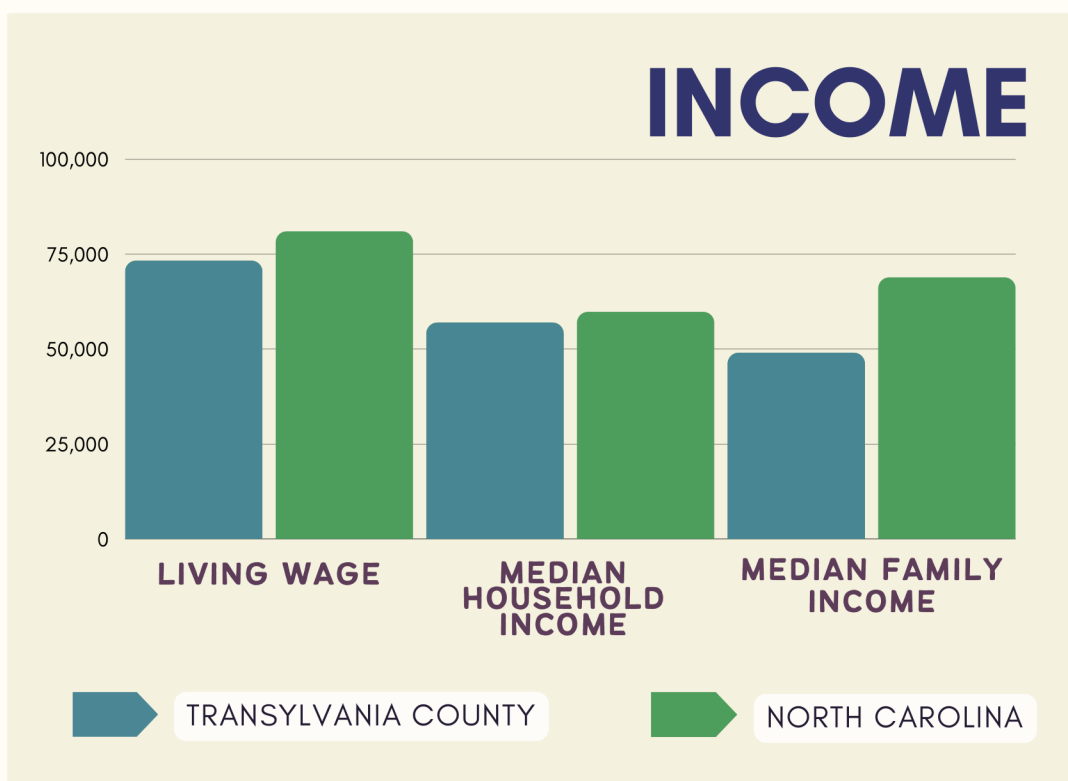
